There are no limits or loan periods and all of the titles are available to view all the time!



### 1. How to Get Started


- Visit our website hansonlibrary.org to find our link to TumbleBook Library. You can find it under the 'Youth Services' tab on the top menu or along the right hand 'Online Services' bar of the homepage
- All you need to log in in your library card! No pin or password required
- While you can use the web version of TumbleBook Library on mobile devices, there is also an app available through the iTunes or Google Play stores
- When using the app, you must log in with your country, state, library, and library card number
- You can have unlimited access from as many computers, tablets, or devices you want, as long as you have a library card number and have a connection to the internet
- All TumbleBook content is streamed, not downloaded, so it never takes up space, but does require an internet connection

### 2. Explore



- Once you've logged in, you can use the menu to toggle between categories to find materials
- You can click on a cover image to see more information about that title, including the author, illustrator, a summary, word count, and A/R, Lexile, and Grade reading level information

#### Coraline



- When you're ready to listen or read, click 'Read Online.' Depending on the format of the item you selected, you can either manually turn the pages or they will turn automatically
- Reading for a set period of time? Selecting 'Playlists' shows you pre-created playlists where eBooks play back to back, just like a music playlist! In addition, you can create your own playlist: simply click on the 'Add to Playlist' button to build your own!
