### WHY NOW?

- A 2023 survey found that our community wants a welcoming, attractive building that provides access to a wide variety of print & electronic resources.
- The current 34-year-old library is too small and lacks infrastructure to meet program and service needs.
- The Town has an opportunity to obtain a state grant to fund up to 55% of the construction costs of a library renovation and construction project.
- The MBLC Construction grant program is only offered once every 8–10 years.



### **HOW TO HELP**

#### 1. Stay Informed

- Follow project updates via newsletters, the library website, and library social media.
- Attend public meetings to learn about design progress and provide feedback.

#### 2. Share Your Voice

• Participate in surveys or community forums to help shape the future of the library.

### 3. Spread the Word

- Talk to neighbors about the importance of the project.
- Share posts on social media to boost community awareness and support.

#### 4. Volunteer

- Help with outreach efforts by distributing flyers, helping with events, or joining a community task force.
- Offer skills such as photography, translation, or writing.

#### 5. Become a Library Advocate

- Speak up at Town Meetings or public hearings to show support.
- Encourage friends and family to get involved and vote in favor of the project at the Annual Town Meeting May 2026.

  Building Program: A detailed document
  prepared by the library outlining current
  and future space and service needs.
- 2. May 2024 Completed a Feasibility Study: This process reviewed the systems and physical state of the current building.
- 3. May 2024 Submitted a Grant
  Application to MBLC: The Town of Hanson applied for state funding through a competitive, multi-step process.
- 4. January 2025 Hanson Awarded a MBLC Planning & Design Grant: Grant to study building addition and renovation options.
- 5. May-June 2025 Hired an Owner's
  Project Manager and Architect: Hanson
  Public Library Building Committee and
  Board of Library Trustees used grants and
  private funding to hire professionals to
  guide the building project.
